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## Annual PGME Professional Development Day Workshops

Workshop 1 - Finding the Balance in PGME: Achieving Technical Requirements with Workplace **Accommodation** - 90 minutes

**Leads**: Dr. Prasad Jetty, Dr. Melissa Langevin and Dr. Erika Tanner

At the end of the workshop, the participants will be able to:

- Acknowledge that technical requirements and educational objectives required to graduate may require modification through implementation of accommodation for trainees with disabilities.
- Recognize how accommodation requests can be met at the individual level without having to create a "one size fits all" approach.
- Apply a process while working through realistic cases to better understand the landscape of accommodation and/or leave requests in order to meet educational objectives.


This activity will be divided with an introduction to the topic:

- through storytelling (10 minutes)
- a short didactic session (15 minutes)
- case-based discussions (45 minutes)
- large group review of cases (10 minutes)
- Q&A (10 minutes)





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#### Workshop 2 - Navigating Issues of Professionalism in PGME

At the end of the workshop, the participants will be able to:

- Define mistreatment and unprofessional behaviours in residents and/or supervisors
- Describe the tools, supports, and services available when dealing with issues of professional behaviour lapses in residents or supervisors
- Discuss current processes and approaches for different unprofessional behaviours

This activity will be divided with an introduction to the topic (10 minutes), a short didactic session (15 minutes), case-based discussions (35 minutes), review of cases with process review (10 minutes), Q&A (15 minutes).

### Workshop 3 - Strengthening the PD/PA Relationship for Program Success

At the end of the workshop, the participants will be able to:
